



Latinos in Technology Scholarship Initiative

We award up to \$10,000 per year for up to three years to Latinx college juniors and seniors who are pursuing a degree in a STEM-related field. Scholars have the opportunity to participate in our Career Launch Academy and Conexiones Mentorship Program to help them develop as young professionals. We also actively work to help our scholars secure summer internships with our investors.

Latino Board Leadership Academy

The Latino Board Leadership Academy trains Latinx business professionals on how to serve as influential leaders on the boards of nonprofit organizations. Because of the popularity of the academy, we were able to offer a third LBLA class in 2021 for the first time since the program's inception.

In October, the HFSV hosted the Hispanic Foundation Ball (Celebration). 
