

LOS AMIGOS DE LA BIBLIOTECA LATINOAMERICANA

La Biblioteca Latinoamericana (the Latin American Library) is a branch of the Public Library targeting Hispanic youth and families in the Gardener community of San José, a high concentration area of Spanish-speaking and low income families. To promote literacy in their community, Los Amigos volunteers will use their grant to continue community outreach to Latino families, provide literacy gift bags for program participants, produce a series of story hours, and feature a popular Hispanic author to conduct storytelling.

SACRED HEART COMMUNITY SERVICES

For more than 30 years, Sacred Heart Community Services continues to provide an array of social services to lowincome populations. The Hispanic Charity Ball grant will help extend and strengthen four outstanding programs that serve the educational and human care needs of Hispanic children and families.

These programs will provide counseling and educational support to children and parents, provide computer access to children, one-on-one tutoring services in math, reading and writing, and field trips to exciting places of learning.

WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

This school will use their grant to create a drama program and expand its folklorico program. The drama program will promote parental involvement in their children's activities, enhance reading, provide group recreational activities and develop opportunities for artistic expression.

Washington's folklorico program will continue to afford opportunities for children to develop and showcase their artistic skills. Located in an innercity neighborhood of San José where economic hardship, gangs and violence are too common, these programs offer positive alternatives by promoting ethnic pride which draw upon the Hispanic community.

THE HISPANIC CHARITY BALL HAS ALLOCATED OVER \$172,000 TO LOCAL COMMUNITY SERVICE AGENCIES WHO PROVIDE DIRECT SERVICES TO HISPANIC YOUTH AND FAMILIES. THIS YEAR'S THREE GRANT RECIPIENTS WERE SELECTED IN ADVANCE OF THIS EVENING, IN AN EFFORT TO INCREASE COMMUNITY VISIBILITY AND SUPPORT FOR THE VERY IMPORTANT SERVICES THEY PROVIDE IN MAKING SANTA CLARA COUNTY A HEALTHIER AND HAPPIER PLACE TO LIVE.



Mrs. Pérez was born in the small town of Ciudad Acuña in the state of Coahuila, Mexico and Mr. Pérez is a proud Texan. Vicente and his wife Raquel, married 38 years, migrated from Texas to San José in the summer of 1959 where they worked the fields, canneries and factories to support and advance their family. Vicente retired in 1994 after 10 years as a case manager with Catholic Charities.

Their dedication and many contributions to the community are based on family unity, faith, a strong work ethic and belief in public service and education. These strong values have been passed down to the Pérez' five sons, Vicente Jr., Victor, Raul, René, and Ricardo.

Side by side, their community involvement has been varied but always based on a strong foundation bound by faith. Mr. Pérez proudly serves the Diocese of San José as Deacon at Most Holy Trinity Church, while Mrs. Pérez is actively involved with the Grail Development Corporation to build affordable housing, a child development center, and a women's resource center. In addition,

other family activities in the community include advocacy in the areas of health and housing, social service programs, services for youth, support for the elderly, bilingual education, flood relief, Chicano theater, the political arena, and the United Farm Workers. Through these many volunteer activities, the Pérez family has garnered the respect and trust of many.

Vicente Jr., a youth counselor, attributes much of his family's success and voluntarism to their involvement with the church and to a philosophy of "Sí Se Puede" (It Can Be Done).

LUIS VALDEZ

CELEBRITY PRESENTER OF LA FAMILIA AWARD


Last month, President Bill J. Clinton appointed Mr. Luis Valdez to the prestigious National Council of the Arts of the United States. This appointment speaks to Luis' varied and remarkable talents and his successes.

He is probably best known as the founder and artistic director of the internationally known *El Teatro Campesino*, the theatrical troupe founded during the Great Delano Grape Strike of 1965. Over the years ETC's productions have garnered critical acclaim and recognition including an Off-Broadway Obie Award and numerous Drama Critics Circle Awards in Los Angeles and San Francisco.

In 1977, a Rockerfeller Foundation Artist-in-Residence grant enabled Valdez to create for the Mark Taper Forum *Zoot-Suit*, one of the most successful plays to originate in Los Angeles, playing to critical and popular acclaim to almost half a million people.

In 1987, Luis wrote and directed for Columbia Pictures one of the year's biggest hit films *La Bamba*. Luis also directed Turner Network Television's 1993 *The Cisco Kid*, filmed entirely on location in Mexico. He is currently in development on a feature film on the life of Cesar Chavez for Warner Brothers.

In 1994, Mr. Valdez was bestowed with Mexico's prestigious Aguila Azteca Award (Golden Eagle) which is the highest decoration citizens of other countries can receive. He holds an honorary Doctorate of Arts degrees from San Jose State University his alma mater, Santa Clara University, Columbia College of Chicago and the California Institute of the Arts.






