Julissa Tinajero was raised in Soledad, CA. and is a first-generation college graduate from San José State University with a Magna Cum Laude degree in Computer Science. Julissa works as a Software Engineer at Ford Motor Company.

Paula Perez, a native of Oaxaca, Mexico, is a dedicated community leader, activist, and mother of four children. Paula graduated from our Parent Education Academies and has been actively involved in advancing her children's education. She is a recognized advocate in education, housing, and childcare at the local and state levels. Additionally, Paula cofounded the Mountain View Solidarity Fund, a grassroots organization that provided financial aid to undocumented individuals during the pandemic.

Jessica Aguirre

Jessica has been a primetime evening anchor at NBC Bay Area for over 20 years. She also is the co-host of NBC Bay Area's Race in America: The Conversation alongside Marcus Washington. This show explores racial equity and social injustice and attempts to bridge the divide between backgrounds and generations.

Throughout his career, Jessica has won an Emmy for her poignant series on the emotional journey of an East Bay transgender teen and her efforts to preserve her fertility before undergoing sex reassignment surgery, another Emmy for her live coverage of the "Ghostship" warehouse fire in Oakland and field anchoring from the deadly Sonoma and Napa county firestorms; and recently was inducted into the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences Silver Circle for twenty-five years of excellence in television journalism.

Jessica resides in the East Bay with her two daughters. Her devotion to learning, supporting children, and local charities has her routinely on the lecture circuit in the Bay Area, discussing education, gender equity, and minority advancement in the workplace. Jessica also serves on the board of Watermark, the Bay Area's largest membership organization dedicated to increasing the number of women in leadership positions.

Jessica can also be found at many community events in the East Bay, where she lends her voice to various local causes.

As the daughter of immigrant parents, Jessica is fluent in Spanish and deeply involved in organizations that promote literacy and help bridge the gap in STEM careers for Latinos. Including the Hispanic Foundation of Silicon Valley, where she has been Master of Ceremonies of the Hispanic Foundation Ball for over 20 years, helping make this night memorable!

Damian Trujillo

Damian has been an NBC Bay Area News reporter for 26 years and the host and producer of "Comunidad del Valle," the longest-running public affairs program in Spanish on Telemundo 48 in the Bay Area.

Throughout his career, Damian has won the prestigious Emmy Award, also named "2004 Reporter of the Year" by the Associated Press Television and Radio Association for California and Nevada and many more.

Damian grew up in Greenfield, about 2 hours south of San Francisco on Highway 101. While in high school, Damian worked in the agricultural fields of the Salinas Valley with his family to help make ends meet. He picked garlic, broccoli, cucumbers, and strawberries.

Every year on the Cesar Chavez Holiday, Damian's wife, Monica, his daughters Malyna and Isela, son Michel Damian and Damian honor his first job by distributing sack lunches to roughly 250 farm workers as a "Thank you" gesture for their tireless work. Also, yearly, the Trujillo family awards a college scholarship to the son or daughter of a farm worker in Greenfield.
